PRESIDENT'S LETTER

ENSURE YOUR DATA IS PROTECTED

In today's digital society, protecting data has become increasingly important. City State Bank wants to ensure consumers know how to determine their digital information is secure.

About 15 million people in the U.S. alone have their identities stolen each year, and those cases result in financial losses of around \$50 billion. Practicing safe online behavior is one simple way that consumers can protect against becoming a victim of cybercrime.

10 simple ways to help secure your data:

- **1. Shred printed documents:** Make sure you shred any documents that contain sensitive information, such as your Social Security number, credit card or bank account numbers.
- **2. Set strong passwords:** Setting strong passwords that use a variety of letters, numbers and special characters helps prevent criminals from accessing your information.
- **3. Be careful shopping online:** Only shop from known and trusted sources, and before entering credit card info, make sure the word, "secure," or a closed padlock icon appear next to the URL in the web address bar.
- **4. Lock your phone:** Locking your phone with a pass code ensures thieves don't gain easy access to your bank accounts, email and other data.
- **5. Know how to spot phishing scams:** Phishing is used to obtain sensitive information by disguising a fraudulent electronic communication as a trustworthy entity. If you are unsure whether the communication is fraudulent or not, contact the organization directly.
- **6. Check URLs before clicking on them:** Before clicking on a link, hover over it to see if the URL. If it looks suspicious and does not actually contain the company name, do NOT click on it.
- **7. Do NOT access accounts using public Wi–Fi:** While it is OK to use such networks for general web browsing, it is unwise to use them to access any type of banking, credit card or shopping account.
- **8. Review privacy settings on social media:** Most social media websites have privacy features that can be enabled to prevent people you don't know from seeing your activity. Explore the settings of the social networks you use to ensure that your accounts are private.
- 9. Take advantage of two-factor authentication: Many websites now offer an extra wall of security through two-factor authentication. Through two-factor authentication, you receive a temporary code through a text message that must be entered before you can log into your account.
- **10. Monitor your credit report:** Your credit report can tell you whether your accounts have been compromised. Visit www.annualcreditreport.com to request your free report each year and examine it for suspicious activity.

Just a reminder, here at City State Bank, we will never call you to confirm your bank account, social security number, etc. If we ever call you, but you are unsure if it is us, please hang up and call us at 515-981-4234 or call the location you use to confirm. Lastly, if you ever feel that you have potentially been scammed, please contact us immediately so that we can put a hold on your accounts and assist you from there. We are here to help!

APRIL IS FINANCIAL LITERACY MONTH

According to a 2015 survey conducted by the National Foundation for Credit Counseling, only 40 percent of U.S. adults have a budget and keep a close eye on their spending habits. By taking an active role in your children's financial education, you can help make sure that number rises. Here are four ways to help start a conversation with your kids about money.

4 WAYS TO TEACH YOUR KIDS ABOUT FINANCES

One of the most effective ways to teach kids about credit and finances is through hands-on experience. Following are four simple ways to help your children practice with money and credit.

- 1. Allowances. Give your child a monthly allowance and explain the importance of saving. If they spend their entire allowance and ask for more, consider giving it to them with the stipulation that it will come out of their next month's allowance. Explain to them that this is like a loan which must be repaid. You can also help them keep track of their spending, so they can see how quickly it adds up or goes away depending on how they use it. You can also tie allowances to daily chores and teach your children that money comes from hard work.
- 2. Budget. Children have the luxury of 100 percent disposable income. With no bills to pay, worry-free spending is easier. Although most children do not have bills, you can teach them to budget by helping them keep track of their spending and saving with an overview of their monthly spending habits.
- 3. Teach them to save. Allowances usually are not large enough to help children afford bigticket items, such as video gaming systems or a new phone. Help them understand how much they need to save each month to afford such items in a specified amount of time. For example, if a new video game system costs \$300, and your child wants to purchase it in six months, he would need to save \$50 per month to afford it. Knowing this will help him budget the remainder of his allowance.
- 4. Introduce them to your bank. Opening a savings and/or checking account for them can help them learn the importance of saving while also helping them keep track of their money.
