

Assistance for Businesses Impacted by CORONAVIRUS

• CARES Act (Including Paycheck Protection Program-PPP):

On March 27th, 2020, President Trump signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, a stimulus bill that includes a loan program to keep small businesses afloat during mandated COVID-19-related closures. The CARES Act includes a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) which authorizes up to \$349 billion federally guaranteed loans to qualifying small businesses. This new loan program is based on the architecture of the SBA's existing 7(a) loan program and will make forgivable loans of up to \$10 million available to qualifying small businesses.

City State Bank is an SBA preferred lender in the Paycheck Protection Program.
